

Giving During Advent

- ✿ **Food First Sunday is December 6 and January 3** - We exceeded our goal of 150 lbs. in November with a total of 236lbs much needed food! If we all shop those BOGOs we will go over our goal of donating ONE TON of food this year to Gainesville Community Ministries. So many good deeds can be done during this season, but food is a necessity. Thanks for your continuing generosity.
- ✿ **Angel Tree**- The Christmas tree arrived in the foyer on Nov. 29th and is covered in Angels for you to take, buy the child's gift that is printed on the Angel and place it, **unwrapped, under the tree by Dec. 13th**. The gifts will be taken to our Gift Market at Rawlings Elementary on Tuesday, December 15th where parents can purchase a gift for their children for a very small amount of money, around \$3 to \$5. All the proceeds then go to Rawlings school for a fund to help with emergencies. So it is a win-win-win! The parents get an inexpensive gift, the child gets a nice gift, and the school gets a good bit of money. Save the week-end for this wonderful annual women's gathering: time to laugh and reflect, to walk and talk, to sing and be silent, to breathe and to pray as we are connected with one another and with ourselves. Come to be nurtured by the beauty of nature and sacred space, the great food, comfortable facilities, and the company of kindred spirits.

Registration forms will be available, beginning Wednesday, January 13. You can pick up a registration form at the church office on week days or on Sunday mornings January 17 and 24; you can download one from the UCG website; or you can contact the church office at info@ucgainesville.org to 378-3500 to request an electronic or a paper form. When you complete your registration form, please put it in an envelope with your payment (*according to the type of room you wish*), indicate if you have any preferences for a roommate(s), and then drop off the envelope or mail it to the church office so that it arrives by **the registration deadline, Wednesday, January 27 by 4pm**. We will not be able to accommodate late registrations.

The cost includes the program, supplies, facility charges, three meals and a motel-type room with two double beds and a private bath: **\$144 for a single room; \$101 for a double room; \$88 for a triple room** (*note that two of the three women in a triple room will share a double bed*). If you are willing to stay in a comfortable **cabin** with 8 other women, **the cost is only \$78 for the week-end**. You will have a bunk to yourself with no one sleeping above or below you – and share a large tiled bathroom with the other women in your cabin. If you need financial aid, **you can request scholarship assistance on your registration form**, which reduces the cost of a double room to \$71, a triple room to \$58, and a cabin room to \$48. We are unable to provide scholarship assistance for single rooms.

From Shelly.....



Many of the old Christmas carols, underneath their sweetness and beauty, reflect a theme of weariness, the desperation of many of the world's peoples, suffering through another year of violence and deprivation. Poverty, war, racism, disease, and environmental degradation all combine to threaten the celebrations all around us.

Yet, also in the old carols, alongside the acknowledgment of the pain, is the persistent message of hope. Consider a portion of the text of "It Came Upon the Midnight Clear:"

"Still through the cloven skies they come, with peaceful wings unfurled, and still their heavenly music floats o'er all the weary world; above its sad and lowly plains they bend on hovering wing, and ever o'er its Babel sounds the blessed angels sing."

In the midst of the challenges in his time (as well as now) of racism, the philosopher and theologian Howard Thurman continued to write his own profound and hopeful words. He is recalling the Magnificat of Mary (Luke 1:39-56) when he writes in his beautiful book, *The Moods of Christmas*:

I Will Sing a New Song

The old song of my spirit has wearied itself out.
It has long ago been learned by heart;
It repeats itself over and over,
Bringing no added joy to my days or lift to my spirit.
I will sing a new song.
I must learn the new song for the new needs.
I must fashion new words born of all the new growth
of my life-- of my mind-- of my spirit.
I must prepare for new melodies that have
never been mine before,
That all that is within me may lift my voice unto God.
Therefore, I shall rejoice with each new day
And delight my spirit in each fresh unfolding.
I will sing, this day, a new song unto the Lord.

This year, every year, may the beauty of this Advent season inspire us to offer our own lives in justice and love, and to give the gift of Hope this Christmas.

We Are Neutral

This fall, the Social Justice Committee at the United Church of Gainesville was exploring ways we can bring environmental concerns to the forefront of the work we were doing on behalf of UCG. And one of us came up with the idea of pursuing being a carbon-neutral congregation.

What does it mean to be carbon neutral?

Basically, any energy we consume results in a carbon footprint- whether it's turning on the lights in the sanctuary or running the A/C for the summer. Carbon dioxide is one of the largest contributors to the greenhouse gases emitted as a result of our energy consumption. By looking at the amount of energy we consume, we can calculate the amount of carbon that is created through our usage-- but there are ways that we can off-set our carbon footprint.

We partnered with the organization "We Are Neutral" to run an assessment of our energy usage and then worked with them to off-set that usage by planting oxygen creators and carbon-dioxide consumers- namely, trees. This winter and spring, we hope to offer you the opportunity to help off-set our carbon footprint through tree-planting field trips we will take with our We Are Neutral partners.

We are proud to be able to call ourselves carbon neutral- and we have issued a challenge to the other churches of the Florida Conference of the United Church of Christ to join us in becoming carbon-neutral; and then to proclaim to the wider denomination that the Florida Conference of the United Church of Christ is carbon-neutral- and they should be too! We are hoping to help inspire the wider church to take active steps towards being an environmentally-forward denomination.

Youth Programs in December and January

Our Chili Lunch Fundraiser is on December 6th, and we hope the whole church will come out to support our program. Youth United uses the money we raise at the Chili Lunch to sponsor our Work Tour and Mystery Trip events every year. This week I came across the poem "Questionnaire" by Wendell Berry. I encourage you to Google it and read the whole thing, but here is the final stanza:

*State briefly the ideas, ideals, or hopes,
the energy sources, the kinds of security;
for which you would kill a child.
Name, please, the children whom
you would be willing to kill.*

It's a pretty intense poem. And yet it reflects almost exactly a very intense national conversation we are having at the moment. I believe Berry correctly identifies the choice between a certain kind of security and the lives of innocent, unnamed children.

It has been disheartening and infuriating to see the responses of many in power to the refugee crisis our world faces. I cannot square my desire to follow the way of Jesus or my belief in a loving God (or a loving humanity!) with the decision to close our state or our arms to those fleeing violence in Syria. My faith asks me to act.

Luckily, you all are way ahead of me (again). We have already been contacted by several church members who are engaged in this work locally. Thanks to them, UCG will be represented in an interfaith group working to welcome potential refugee families here in Gainesville. We don't yet know what this will look like or what it will ask of us, but as that unfolds, I hope you will join us in doing whatever it takes to help whomever we can.

Welcome to another UCG holiday season! It is busy with all of the fun we pack in, and we respect that life is already busy with little ones in play. So, here is all the info. you need in one e-mail.

Saturday, December 5 - 1:30-2:30 Christmas Pageant rehearsal for 4th and 5th graders ONLY in the Sanctuary. No other ages need attend. Shay Smith will lead the 4th and 5th graders through their parts.

2:30-5 - Board of Children's Ministries Presents the Annual Christmas Craft Fair: All children are invited to attend the annual Christmas Craft Fair where they can make all kinds of fun holiday crafts to keep or give in the West Wing and Reimer Hall. **Immediately following the Fair** we will congregate for a picnic in the courtyard. Bring a blanket for your family and pack a picnic dinner OR bring your blanket and purchase pizza by the slice and bottled water for a small donation to be used toward our playground fund.

Sunday, December 6 - Christmas Pageant Sunday during the 9:15 service only! Please bring your child to the West Wing by 8:45a.m. where the guides will be available to assist you in getting your child dressed for pageant. Then head to the Sanctuary with your child to grab a seat and to seat your child in their clearly marked grade's row up front. There will be a childcare aide (in brown shirt) there to check in your child at the end of their row.

FAQ's for Pageant:

Did my child make a costume? - Yes, if they were at church on 11/1 or 11/8. If not, don't worry! Those kids who were there made plenty extra for their friends.

What is my child missed the rehearsal? - No problem! Just seat them in their correct row, and we'll take care of getting them on stage for their part.

What does my child need to wear? - They can wear whatever they wish from regular church clothes to something they feel is special for pageant. All that matters is that they are happy.

What is my child in the play? - Pre-K (age 3,4, and 5)- The animals- cow, pig, donkey, **K-1** Sheep or Angel, **2-3** Wise People, **4-5** Speaking part, stage crew, or sign holder

Is there anything to be nervous about? - No! The best parts of pageant are when something previously unexpected happens. Let's just enjoy making memories!

Saturday, December 12th- Lessons and Carols Rehearsal! Please do your best to get to this one if your child will be in Lessons and Carols this year. We will meet in the West Wing at 9a.m. to practice with just children before heading over to join the large Lessons and Carols group in the Sanctuary at 9:30a.m. We hope to be done by 10a.m.

Sunday, December 13th- Lessons and Carols Performances at 11a.m. and 7p.m. Children will rehearse in the Room 5 from 10:30-11a.m. Then they will head in to perform. For the 7p.m. performance, there will not be an additional rehearsal, so just be seated in the sanctuary.

Racial Justice Task Force

The City of Gainesville's Office of Equal Opportunity is sponsoring a "Dessert and Dialogue" film series on health disparities through their Dismantling Prejudices and Biases Initiative. The next part in this series will be shown on Monday, December 14 and will be facilitated by Dr. Nancy Hardt. Dr. Hardt is a colleague of UCG member (and RJTF Co-Chair) Lance Gravlee, who studies the health effects of racism. Tally Rally 2016

Two years ago, our church made its first trip to Tallahassee to advocate on behalf of legislation to protect people of all sexual orientations, gender identities and expressions, and their families. A lot has changed for LGBTQ people in America over the last two years. AND we still have a long way to go to full justice and equality.

In many areas of Florida, a person can still be fired from her job or denied housing or public accommodations based on her sexual orientation, gender identity or expression! That should shock us and move us to action on behalf of the statewide nondiscrimination act for which Equality Florida and members of UCG will be lobbying.

Our work for full LGBTQ equality and non-discrimination continues on our 3rd annual Equality Florida Lobby Days trip, fondly termed the "Tally Rally". Hosted by UCG's Open and Affirming Committee in coordination with Equality Florida, participants will travel overnight to Tallahassee from **Sunday, January 24 to Monday, January 25th**. There we will receive an update on the current climate of the Florida legislature, learn lobbying techniques and meet with state legislators to advocate for LGBTQ justice through appropriate legislation.

The cost per participant will be approximately \$65 which includes round-trip carpool transportation to Tallahassee on Sunday afternoon (returning Monday evening), 2-person shared hotel lodging at the Baymont Inn and Equality Florida's registration fee. We want to share our appreciation for the many volunteers that made our November 1st hosting week a great success.
