"Rise Up!"



Supplemental Pledge Campaign Underway

It is time for us to vote to approve our 2016 UCG Proposed Budget at the Winter Congregational Meeting Sunday, January 24. Many of you have pledged to support UCG's work and life with your financial giving. Thank you for your commitment to this beloved congregation!

Our pledge campaign has fallen short of what is needed for us to fund the important work that we are about as a congregation, and now it is time for us to WAKEN to the possibilities for UCG's important work in this new year! WE NEED YOUR SUPPORT! **Our shortfall stands at \$62,182.00.** If each of us who have already pledged would add just \$22/month to our pledge for 2016, we would reach our goal. Some of us will not be able to do this, and some of us will be able to contribute more.

There are pledge cards in the foyer. You may drop it off in the church office, mail it back to UCG or go to www.ucgainesville.org to make your supplemental pledge. This pledge card indicates the amount that you are adding to the pledge you have already made for 2016. If you have not yet pledged, it is NOT TOO LATE! Thank you for your support!

Sign up continues for our Annual Oxfam Fast - Our UCG fast, however known, begins after lunch on January 20. **We gather to break the fast at 6:00 p.m. on Thursday, January 21st in Reimer Hall,** when you may contribute the money you saved on food to Oxfam. Sign up to bring soup, salad, bread, juice, or fruit and bring your own bowls, plates, cups, and utensils. Childcare with pizza and fruit will be provided from 6 to 8 p.m. Please sign up if you need childcare. Women's Overnight - Registration continues for "Places in the Heart" - Saturday, February 13, 10:00 am to Sunday, February 14 at 12:00 pm, Episcopal Conference Center, Live Oak, Florida. The cost includes the program, supplies, facility charges, three meals and a motel-type room with two double beds and a private bath: \$144 for a single room; \$101 for a double room; \$88 for a triple room (note that two of the three women in a triple room will share a double bed). If you are willing to stay in a comfortable cabin with 8 other women, the cost is only \$78 for the weekend. You will have a bunk to yourself with no one sleeping above or below you – and share a large tiled bathroom with the other women in your cabin. If you need financial aid, you can request scholarship assistance on your registration form, which reduces the cost of a double room to \$71, a triple room to \$58, and a cabin room to \$48. We are unable to provide scholarship assistance for single rooms. The deadline to register is Wednesday, January 27 at 4:00pm. Please contact the church office if you have any questions about the registration process.

From Shelly.....



One of the joys of each new year's arrival is the chance to take stock of one's life. We may look back with gratitude as well as lean forward in anticipation.

As we are in the midst of our supplemental pledge campaign, I am thankful that as I was growing up, my parents and my home church taught me to give a percentage of my income to the work of my congregation. My parents gave 10% and taught me to do the same. My first memory of knowing I was an important part of the work of my church is being about 7 years old and getting a \$1.00/week as an allowance. My dad gave me that \$1.00 in dimes and helped me understand what my tithe (10%) meant. Like most families then and now, we had many financial challenges, but my dad modeled the behavior he taught me. He wrote a check for his tithe every week, too.

When I was in college, it was harder to keep up the practice when at my job I only made \$50.00/ week, but by then, it was a habit, like paying for anything else I valued in my life: 10% to the offering. With time and experience, pledging/ giving a percentage of my income to the work of the church also became a spiritual joy as well because when I pooled my limited resources with the resources of others, then together we were able to manifest what we believed in.

I say it a lot--*money manifests mission*. It felt empowering back then, and every Sunday since then, to make that decision about the money I had. Of the many financial priorities in my life now, giving to UCG is top. I believe in what we do here and I support it with my tithe.

There are many financial priorities in our lives and even at best, not unlimited money. It is challenging to choose between the priorities because for various reasons, *all* are important to us. I know and trust our church family. As we come ever nearer to achieving the financial goal we set for ourselves at our congregational meeting in October, I know we will make UCG as close to the top of the priority list as we can, each and every one of us.

Thank you for your partnership in the good work we do in this world. In this new year, we are supremely blessed!

The UCG 3-Year Plan for 2016-2019: What's Happened and What's Next?

The Survey: We thank the 353 folks who completed the 3-Year Planning Survey in November. With approximately half of the congregation responding, we believe the results are representative of who we are and what areas of our church's life we should expand upon in the next three years. Just one result from the survey - the top four answers to question #3 (Which of the following best describes your spiritual identity?) were: Liberal Christian -52%, Other -15%, Agnostic -14%, and Traditional Christian -9%. Thanks again to Taylor Stein for putting the survey together, and to Taylor and Sara Magnuson for keeping track of the SurveyMonkey submissions and for generating clear summaries of the results. These summaries are available to church members in the main office, and have been sent to all board and committee chairs.

The 3-Year Plan: A CMRB subcommittee of Barbara Rienzo, Erick Smith, and Shelly Wilson has reviewed the survey results and come up with three suggested priorities for the 2016-2019 3-Year Plan based on the areas most chosen by church members in the survey. The process used to formulate these priorities will be presented to Church Council in January, and at the Congregational Meeting on January 24th. Soon after that the congregation will join in helping to envision specific steps for each priority, leading to the final 3-year plan that will hopefully be approved at the May congregational meeting.

To my UCG community,

Most of you know that I was convicted 10 years ago for crimes I committed as a result of my mental illness. After being incarcerated in the county jail and a state prison I began 14 years of probation. 5 years after my original conviction I experienced another mental health crisis that put me back in jail. I received an amazing level of support from UCG during the process that ensued. I'm now asking my UCG community for your support again.

The judge that presides over the county's Mental Health Court, the Hon. Denise Ferraro, has indicated that she will consider me for Early Successful Termination of my probation. This would significantly improve my quality of life as I have no civil rights and I'm very restricted in my travels beyond Alachua County's borders.

I need your help by attending the hearing where Judge Ferraro will begin her deliberations. Two of the main things she said she will take into consideration are my stability and my support network. The members of UCG have been huge in the re-stabilizing of my life and form a significant portion of my support network. Most of those involved in the criminal justice system have no support network at all. My having such a large community of folks ensures that not only do I have plenty of people to rely on in a crisis, but, more importantly, to help prevent crises from arising at all.

The hearing will take place on Wednesday February 3rd at 1:30 PM in courtroom 1C of the Criminal Justice Center, 220 South Main Street. Parking is available in the city's downtown garage located 2 blocks east.
